16. Renato buys 5 ham sandwiches which cost \$8.95 each and 2 tuna sandwiches which cost \$4.95 each. If he gives the cashier a hundred dollar bill, how much change does he receive?
  
17. The ratio of white cars to blue cars in a parking lot is 4:9. If there are 16 white cars in the lot, how many blue cars are there?
  
18. If 40 students took an exam and  $\frac{1}{5}$  of them failed, how many passed?
  
19. Compute:  $-7 + 11 - 3 - 4$
  
20. If a TV set sells for \$2,400 and is on sale for 40 % off, what the new cost of the TV?
